GENERAL INFORMATION FOR TEACHERS

The Saskatchewan Professional
Teachers Regulatory Board is
responsible for the establishment and
administration of the professional
certification and standards of
professional conduct and competence
of teachers for the purposes of serving
and protecting the public interest.

A teacher's certificate is required to teach in the provincial system in Saskatchewan. A 'Professional A' Teacher's Certificate is issued to applicants who meet the criteria as set out in the SPTRB Regulatory Bylaws.

All teachers must apply for certification in Saskatchewan prior to working in Saskatchewan. The application form and complete information regarding required documents can be found at www.sptrb.ca

Teachers certified in other Canadian jurisdictions will be certified in Saskatchewan once a complete application

including confirmation of certification from all other jurisdictions in which they are certified is received.

The requirements for a teacher's certificate are as follows:

- Hold a bachelor's degree (4 year or equivalent);
- Complete a teacher training program comprised of at least 48 semester hours of teacher education coursework, including specific required courses and a practicum.

Teachers who have received a teacher's certificate and who work as teachers in the Saskatchewan K-12 school system are required to register each year with the SPTRB.

The names of all registered teachers appear on the SPTRB public registry.



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
